2022-2023 School Field Trips – National Core Arts Standards/Visual Arts

All field trips are suitable for any size of group (20-120) and can be customized based on your needs. Don't see a topic you want? Work with our ARTitorium Education Specialist to make a custom field trip.

Kindergarten • There is an Alligator Under My Bed!

Our favorite book in an art lesson. What will be under your bed? And what will your alligator eat?

- Anchor Standard 1: Generate and conceptualize artistic ideas and work.
- Essential Question: What conditions, attitudes and behaviors support creativity and innovative thinking?
- VA: Cr1.1.1.Ka Engage collaboratively in creative art-making in response to an artistic problem.

1st Grade • Art Words

We will use fun art words to make our own art!

- Anchor standard 3: Refine and complete artistic work.
- Essential Question: How do artists grow and become accomplished in art forms?
- VA:cr3.1.1a Use art vocabulary to describe choices while creating art.

2nd Grade • Happy Art

We will look at some fun contemporary pop artists and make our own happy art.

- Anchor standard 8: Interpret intend and meaning in artistic work.
- Essential Question: How can the viewer "read" a work of art as text?
- VA:re8.1.2a Interpret art by identifying the mood suggested by a work of art and describing relevant subject matter and characteristics of form

3rd Grade • Music and Drawing

We will see some art, listen to some cool music and make our own art.

- Anchor Standard 2: Organize and develop artistic ideas and work.
- Essential Question: How do artists work?
- VA:Cr2.1.3a Create personally satisfying artwork using a variety of artistic processes and materials.
- Also: Anchor Standard 1 Generate and conceptualize artistic ideas and work.
- Essential Question: What factors encourage people to take creative risks.
- VA:Cr1.1.3a: Elaborate on an imaginative idea.

4th Grade • I See, I Think, I Wonder

Where do artist get ideas to make art?

- Anchor Standard 1: Generate and conceptualize artistic ideas and work.
- Essential question: What factors encourage people to take creative risks?
- VA:Cr1.1.4a Brainstorm multiple approaches to a creative art or design problem.
- Also: Anchor Standard 2: Organize and develop artistic ideas and work.
- Essential question: How do artist work.
- VA: cr2.1.4a Explore and invent art-making techniques and approaches.

5th or 6th Grade • Landscapes

Drawing a forest, we will learn how artists use "tricks" to make things look close and far away.

5th or 6th Grade • Chinese Cinderella

Some people think our story of Cinderella was inspired by a Chinese story that started in 800AD. Compare the Chinese version with the one you know and then let's do some drawing of a traditional Chinese Palace.

- 5th: Anchor Standard 2: Organize and develop artistic ideas and work.
- Essential Question: How do artists work?
- VA:Cr2.1.5a Experiment and develop skills in multiple art-making techniques and approaches through practice.
- 6th Grade: Anchor Standard 7 Perceive and analyze artistic work.
- Enduring Understanding: Individual aesthetic awareness developed through engagement with art can lead to understanding and appreciation of others.
- Essential question: How does learning about art impact how we perceive the world?
 VA:re.7.1.6a Identify and interpret works of art or design that reveal how people live around the world and what they value.
